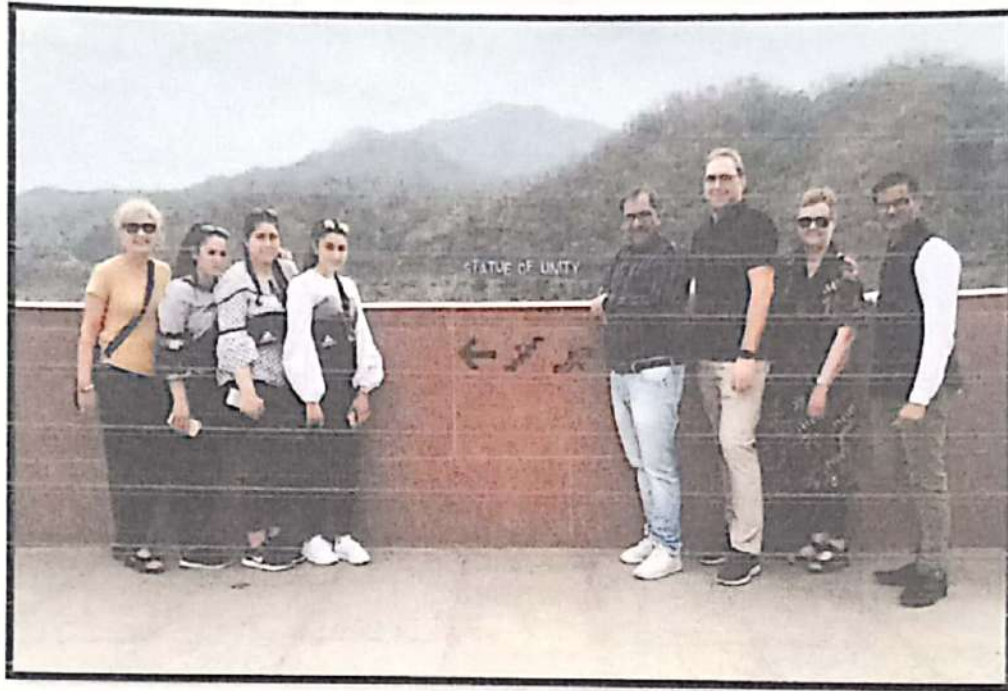
Day 3: 14/01/2020 (Tuesday)

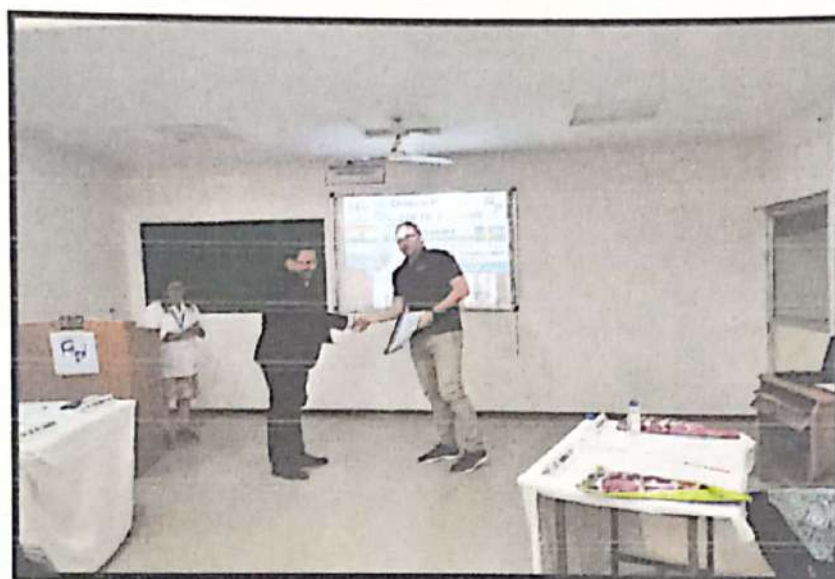


Kite Flying with Music and Garba on Terrace

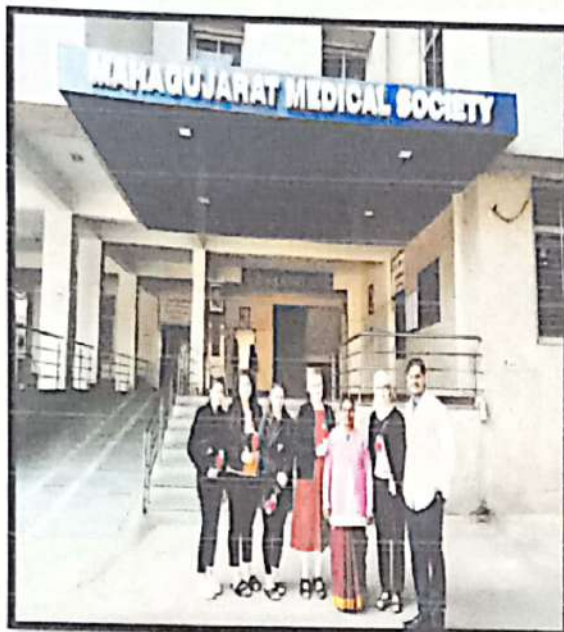




Day 6: 17/01/2020 (Friday)
